She looked at our tickets. 'The next flight? This is the end of your journey. Where **did you want** to go?'

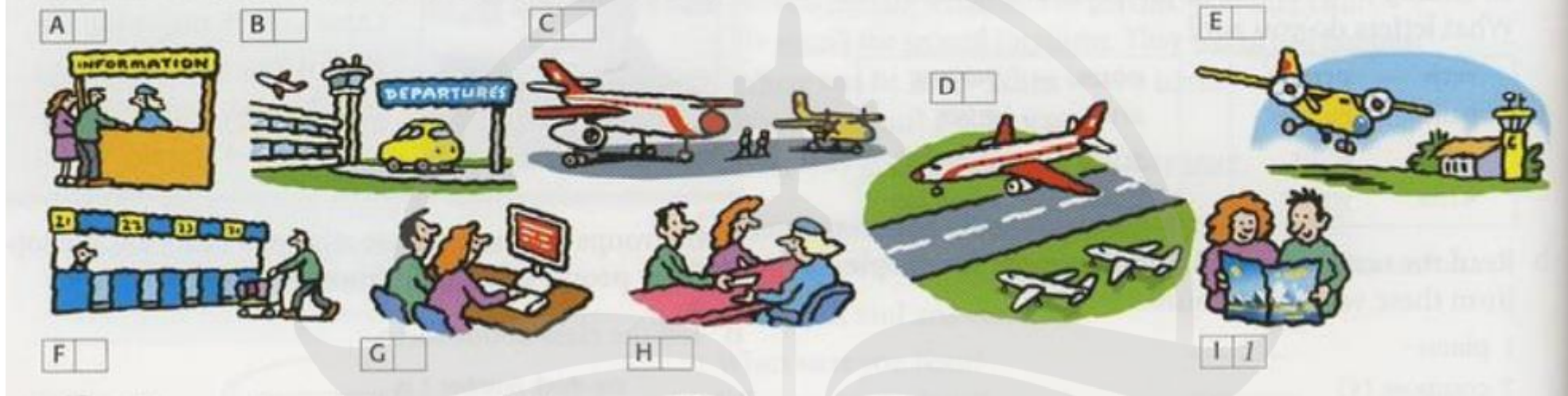
'Where are we?' I asked.

- **Contraction:** *didn't* = *did not*.
- Use the past simple for finished actions.
- Regular verbs in the past **+** end in -ed, e.g. *worked*, *lived*, *played*.
- The past is the same for all persons.
- Use *did* / *didn't* + infinitive for past **?** and **-**.
